Condition: The original cover has been taped along the spine. The text block is dry and slightly acidified and there are occasional chips along the edges of pages.

Condition: good. Original covers worn with use at edges.

Condition: Very good. Library binding stamped in gold.

Condition: good. The boards in original cloth stamped in gold are clean and hardly worn except at top and bottom of the spine. Text block is secure and unacidified.
